Summer Youth Job \$9.00/hour. This is a 2-month position (June 30 – August 22nd) located in Del Norte County CA thru the California Center for Rural Policy at Humboldt State University. This is not a state or federal position.

Position Title: Youth Research Assistant

Position Summary: All participants will be required to participate in: 1) weekly trainings on life skills and job readiness skills, 2) Community projects/organizing, 3) Career development, 4) Healthy living, 5) Social Connection and 6) Research and data analysis. This will give youth employees the opportunity to be involved in the Building Healthy Communities Initiative, but also the opportunity to gain valuable skills and relationships in the Del Norte and Adjacent Tribal Lands workforce.

Position Description: CCRP expects all employees to conduct themselves in the utmost professional manner for the good and wellbeing of all—everyone is EXPECTED to:

- Participate in required trainings/workshops/ site placements
- Listen with respect and talk with respect
- Effectively communicating to your supervisors: questions, concerns, attendance etc.
- Be an ambassador and good representative of Del Norte and the Adjacent Tribal Lands and CCRP
- Notify CCRP in advance if you will not be coming to work
- Be professional and courteous at all times
- Be prepared to have a great experience, and contribute to a positive experience for everyone involved
