

*The BHC Charrette will produce a report that includes data about current conditions, public feedback received during the Charrette, and recommendations for action. **That report will inform local organizing, service provision, and advocacy efforts in the BHC moving forward.***

What is a Charrette?

A Charrette is a multi-day public planning process that collects a lot of public input in a short amount of time. A team of designers and experts generate plans in real time based on input received from the community. A Charrette is unique because it provides timely opportunities for feedback and revisions, and concludes with a final product.

How does a Charrette work?

*The planning team will collect background research on all existing conditions in the community and conduct extensive stakeholder outreach. Then the planning event, or Charrette, will take place and include a number of interactive public events and meetings, all while a team of designers and experts work on incorporating public feedback into a final set of products to be presented at the end of the Charrette. **The planning team will take all of the final products into one big report in November 2014.***
