➤ Workshop: President Obama recently issued an Executive Order granting Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). Without getting too deep into the legal technicalities, DACA is basically an exercise of prosecutorial discretion that benefits undocumented youth by giving them access to employment authorization and removing the threat of deportation. It is not a path to a green card but it does provide incredibly important practical benefits for those who are eligible. In an effort to help students navigate the eligibility guidelines and application process, UC Davis Immigration Law Clinic, CRLA and Mexican Consulate will host a Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) workshop to assist eligible DREAM students to apply for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA and work authorization on Saturday, September 29th from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. The law students providing assistance will be trained and supervised by experienced immigration attorneys. Please help us get the word out to potential applicants in your classes, schools, and districts. The workshop is not limited to Mexican nationals.
